New Orleans: Two Years After Katrina

By March 2007, it was estimated that 200,000 former residents, over 150,000 of them Black, had still not been able to return to New Orleans. The poor and Black Lower 9th Ward still lies largely in ruins. The government is now

going ahead with plans to demolish four public housing complexes that could house 4,700 families and replace them with "mixed income" housing that will include less than 750 low-income units. On December 20, police tear-gassed and tased protesters at a city council meeting on the demolitions.

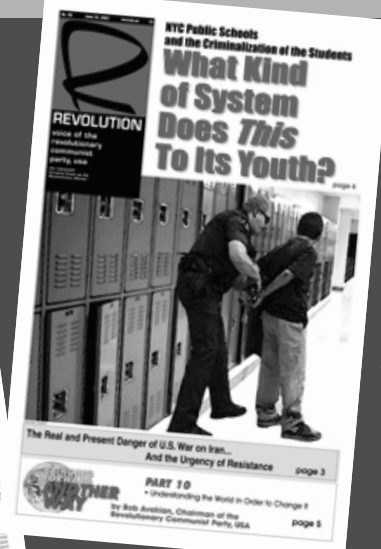

Oaxaca

On July 16, state and municipal police forces brutally attacked more than 10,000 people in Oaxaca City, the capital of the southern Mexican state of Oaxaca, who had gathered at the Plaza de la Danza to participate in a cultural event. The scenes of the clash were reminiscent of the months-long people's rebellion in Oaxaca to oust the hated Governor Ulises Ruiz Ortiz (URO) that came to a head in the summer of 2006.
