WEEK OF OUTRAGE - Wednesday, Dec. 10th High School and College Walkouts & Die-Ins Police murder must stop! NO business as usual!

Justice for Michael Brown, Eric Garner, Tamir Rice, Ezell Ford, Omar Abrego and all victims of murdering cops!



"Business as usual" means you could be the next Black or brown kid shot down by police. "Business as usual" means killer cops get paid vacations, while the precious lives they've stolen are called "thugs." "Business as usual" means mothers' tears, means the kind of pain that cuts way down deep and never goes away.

Since the announcement that the murderer of Mike Brown walked free, thousands and thousands of people are disrupting "business as usual." They are taking to the streets, blocking traffic, blocking freeways and bridges, walking out of school and work, refusing to swallow and choke on their pain this time. Those standing up so boldly and bravely are changing the direction of history! They are refusing to play by the rules when the rules of the system say: stay calm while we kill you. All of us are capable of this kind of courage.

And now, the cops who choked Eric Garner to death in New York are ALSO walking free! This has to stop! What kind of world do you want to live in? What kind of person do you want to be? Do you want to accept and go along with what they are doing to us? Or do you want to stand up and change the world?

Wednesday, Dec. 10th, disrupt business as usual! Three things you can do:

- 1) Mike Brown had his hands in the air when he was shot and killed. Organize people in your classes to put their hands in the air all at the same time during class, take pictures of yourselves doing this and post on Instagram, Facebook, etc. with #weekofoutrage.
- 2) Mike Brown's body was left on the sidewalk for 4½ hours. At lunchtime, do a "die-in," get together with other students to all lie down in the lunch area together for 4½ minutes. Or "die-in" at administration or police buildings or offices at your school. If you have chalk, have some people do chalk outlines of the bodies.
- 3) Walk out of school and march to other schools to call on them to join you. Make signs to carry so everyone knows why you are marching.
